Due to the impending construction at the Botanical Garden, HSNA is now meeting at our new location. The Brahan Spring Recreation Center is located on Ivy Ave. just to the north of the Huntsville Senior Center. The address is 3770 Ivy Ave. Huntsville, 35805.
